#### *From Merritt Parkway South (toward New York)*

Exit 52, follow Route 108 signs, left off ramp onto Route 108 South (Nichols Ave.), drive 3/10 of a mile, left onto Hawley Lane. Hotel is 3/10 of a mile on left.

#### *From I-95 North*
