

ADVANCED PDF SUPPORT FEATURES



Viewing and Navigating PDFs

- › View PDF documents instantly, even pages from large (500+) page PDFs.
- › See each page of the PDF listed within the Case Explorer tree, and click on any page to jump to it in the PDF file. (Previous versions only created a single record for the entire PDF.) When you open an existing case in v5.2, the PDF files previously added using an earlier version of TrialDirector are automatically paginated in Case Explorer.
- › Use the *Page Scroller* to immediately navigate to any page within the PDF.
- › Use the *Magnifier* tool to zoom in on a selected area of a PDF.
- › Rotate any page of a PDF and it will remain that way each time you view it.

Using PDFs in Transcript Manager

- › Use any page from a PDF as a synchronized exhibit for DVT clips.
- › Use any page from a PDF as a Global Keyword Exhibit.

Customizing and Annotating PDF Content

- › Create a new PDF file from selected PDF pages using the *Make PDF file from Selected Items* feature.
- › Combine pages from different PDF files into a new PDF file using the *Make PDF file from Selected Items* feature.
- › Apply Exhibit Labels to any page of a PDF document.
- › Add highlight, arrow, line, rectangle, ellipses, and freehand annotations to any page of a PDF document.
- › Redact any page of a PDF document. All redaction styles (black, white, borders, labels, etc.) will work for PDF documents.
- › Add Sticky Notes and Text Labels to any page of a PDF.
- › Use Hot Spot annotations on any page of a PDF.
- › Transfer all annotations to PDFs (which are saved to the case database) along with your case whenever you use the Export Workbook Contents feature or the Copy Case feature.

Printing PDFs

*Print placeholders are no longer used

- › Print selected pages of one or more PDF documents.
- › Print entire PDF documents.
- › Print PDFs with pre-existing annotations, redactions, and watermarks.
- › Print PDFs with slipsheets between each document.
- › Print PDFs with custom footers and barcodes.
- › Print thumbnail reports from PDFs, including markups, redactions, and barcodes.

Presenting PDFs

- › Display PDFs with pre-treated annotations from Document Manager in Presentation mode. (Pre-treated redactions are fully functional and do not expose background information when zoomed / panned in Presentation mode.)
- › Display PDFs with pre-treated annotation layers in Presentation mode.
- › Immediately display any page from a PDF document using the Workbook dropdown or by typing in the Item ID.
- › Zoom, rotate, or pan any page of a PDF in Presentation mode.
- › Quickly navigate to any page within a PDF document currently displayed in the active zone.
- › Load multiple pages of the same PDF document at once in different zones.
- › Add live annotations to any page of a PDF document during presentation.
- › Add any callout projection type on any page of a PDF document during presentation.
- › Create a Snapshot of any page of a PDF document in Presentation mode.

Using PDF Content in Other Programs

- › View a thumbnail image of each selected PDF page when you export the PDF to a Microsoft Word outline. (Previous version only sent the document level item to the outline and would only render a print placeholder.)
- › Copy a selected area of a PDF to the clipboard to paste it into another application (such as PowerPoint or Word).

Other Specifications

- › Does not require a separate plug-in; all functionality is built into TrialDirector v5.2.
- › Does not require an Adobe Acrobat or Adobe Reader installation.
- › Fully compatible with Adobe Acrobat and Adobe Reader 9 applications.
- › Compatible with PDF files created against PDF Specification 1.3, 1.4, 1.5 and 1.6.
- › Supports PDF documents that were created with standard 40-bit and 128-bit encryption.
- › Renders all graphic objects, existing PDF annotations, color spaces, patterns, shadings, images, text and font types (Type 1, TrueType, Type 0, Type 3).
- › Supports unlimited zoom factor.
- › Supports PDF files containing Chinese, Japanese, and Korean character sets.
